Before we are able to offer you access to the database, please agree to the following terms of use.

After approval, you (the "Researcher") receive permission to use the ScanNet++ database (the "Database") at the Technical University of Munich. In exchange for being able to join the ScanNet++ community and receive such permission, Researcher hereby agrees to the following terms and conditions:

1. Researcher shall use the Database only for non-commercial research and educational purposes. Commercial use is strictly prohibited.
2. Technical University of Munich makes no representations or warranties regarding the Database, including but not limited to warranties of non-infringement or fitness for a particular purpose.
3. Researcher accepts full responsibility for his or her use of the Database and shall defend and indemnify Technical University of Munich, including their employees, Trustees, officers and agents, against any and all claims arising from Researcher's use of the Database, including but not limited to Researcher's use of any copies of copyrighted 3D models that he or she may create from the Database.
4. Researcher may only provide research associates and colleagues with the data, after the receiving entity has also agreed to and signed these terms and conditions. Sharing the data otherwise is strictly prohibited.
5. Following GDPR, Researcher must ensure that they can delete all person-specific data of a person upon request.
6. Technical University of Munich reserves the right to terminate Researcher's access to the Database or parts thereof at any time.
7. If Researcher is employed by a for-profit, commercial entity, Researcher's employer shall also be bound by these terms and conditions, and Researcher hereby represents that he or she is fully authorized to enter into this agreement on behalf of such employer.
8. The German Law shall apply to all disputes under this agreement.
